Kojonup District High School, 260km from Perth, caters for 262 children from Kindergarten to Year 10.

The school campus is attractive and inviting with landscaped gardens, established trees and a variety of playgrounds, including a newly constructed Nature Playground. Tennis, basketball and netball courts are used extensively for PE lessons and by the senior students at recess and lunchtimes.

Our community farming heritage and our specific use of the school's 182 hectare farm has led to us achieving accreditation as a Waste Wise, Water Wise and Sustainable school. To complement this and the other 'modern' farming practices we use such as hydroponics and aquaponics, we still operate a 720 head flock of Merino sheep for wool and a source of income.

Primary children benefit from the opportunity to utilise specialist facilities including Science, Art, Home Economics, IT Lab and Design and Technology area. Interactive Boards are in use in most rooms and there is an additional bank of laptops for in class use.

Teachers at Kojonup District High School are committed, motivated and innovative educators who support and encourage the development of students for the 21st Century. Our team of early childhood staff provide high quality and engaging classes closely aligned to the Early Years Learning Framework. The school maintains a strong focus on literacy and numeracy, our well established performing and visual arts programs and Work Place Learning Program compliment core learning areas.

In 2018 we will partner with the Stephen Michael Foundation to deliver a leadership development program to all students in Years 7-10. Kojonup DHS will pilot this program in the South West Regional Education District. The aim of the program is to assist youth to achieve their goals and become valued members of the community.

We are ably supported by a School Chaplain who is in the school for three days each week, a School Psychologist one day per week. The Chaplaincy Committee provides a twice weekly 'second breakfast' for those who have either missed breakfast or had it very early in the morning.

We strongly encourage parent involvement in the school and believe that the best results are achieved when parents and teachers work together for the benefit of their children. Kojonup DHS has an active and committed School Council and P&C.
